Member Spotlight Kiona Assing, BSc (Civil Engineering), PMP® Project Management in Aviation

I was involved in Project Management long before stepping into aviation – before even imagining the industry would need it. I was unemployed for over a year, coming out of a Project Civil Engineer role. A former colleague, working in airport maintenance, mentioned that the engineering department needed assistance. It had never occurred to me that civil engineering and project management roles existed within the industry. Looking back, I realize how unaware I was of the vast opportunities for our profession.

I had already studied for the PMP® exam but had not yet sat it. I was told that to be considered, certification was essential. That was the push I needed - I sat the exam within the month and started my new role. Still, that opportunity was only a catalyst, not the true motivation. My interest in Project Management started years earlier, when the owner of my first internship company suggested it as a career path. That company provided project management services for large construction projects. At the time, I didn't see the significance of his advice, but over the years, I realized I was involved in numerous projects. I couldn't identify it as such as I was looking at my career through narrow, technical, civil engineering lens. That realization helped shaped my philosophy: project management isn't confined to one sector, it transcends boundaries, which leads me to what I believe is fundamental for budding project managers: The transferable skills we develop - planning, communication, organization - don't just serve us professionally, they enrich our daily lives. When applied consistently, they strengthen both confidence and competence. You strengthen those 'project management muscles' in your everyday life and get to flex them at work. Project Management shouldn't be thought of as belonging to only one industry or sector, it transcends boundaries.

For over two decades, Parmanand Birju has been a dedicated member of PMISCC and a committed professional in the process plant industry. His journey into project management began with a desire to deliver projects more effectively and with greater structure. That motivation led him to pursue further project management qualifications and the PMP® certification, which he describes as a turning point in his career. "The PMP® gave me a framework that I could apply across different types of projects, not just on plant turnarounds," he reflects.

One highlight of his PMI journey was attending a PMI Global Summit which he expressed gave him the chance to connect with PMs from around the world and reinforced his view that PMISCC is a talented group of PMs amongst their global peers. "The exchange of ideas and best practices, and the opportunity to engage in collaborative discussions was invaluable," he recalls. For him, PMISCC has been more than a professional association; it has been a community of knowledge, support, and inspiration. He credits his Chapter with making noticeable improvements in its engagement with its members during his membership tenure.

When asked what advice he would share, he is clear: for budding PMs, it is about staying curious, committed to learning, and most importantly, "recognizing the power of soft skills. Being an effective PM is not just about technical skills" he states. "A project manager is only as good as the team s/he develops, builds, motivates, and allows to learn from mistakes (because they will happen); any project's success is, in large part, based on the performance of the project team." For experienced practitioners, he encourages adaptability – reminding us that the profession continues to evolve, and so must we.
